## Report from Kilburn Parish Council – July 2024

The volunteers continue to work at the nature reserve (see separate article) and have assisted the Parish Council to submit 2 bids for Grants to help continue with the improvement.

It was reported that the Planning Application for Land north of Denby is currently 'on hold' to enable the Planning Board to visit the site.

The Parish Council has succeeded in obtaining a Grant from the Police Commissioner for additional Speed Indicator Devices to be installed in Kilburn. These are now on order and will hopefully be delivered & installed around September/October.

Following the Parish Council's 'Dog Waste Survey' the worst areas where dog owners are not picking up their dog faeces have been identified. A report will be published in a future edition of the Kilburn Community News.

As previously published – the structure of the annual garden competition has changed this year – when gardens needed to be nominated for entry. A short list will be formed and those gardens on the short list will be judged by the Mayor of Amber Valley Borough Council at the end of July & presentation of prizes to winners will be prior to the September meeting.

The Borough Council are to identify & line a disabled parking spot in Church St car park. The Parish Council has received numerous complaints about the work being undertaken by utility companies in Kilburn. We have sent those complaints both to Derbyshire County Council and the utility companies, however, it has been difficult to see any improvement in their working practices.

Keeping you updated

Hi Folks.

As I sit in the office this morning and look at the glorious sunshine, I wish that I had prepared this article when it was raining for what seemed like months! Fingers crossed that Summer has finally arrived.

## Do you keep poultry? New rules are being introduced to help protect the poultry industry from bird flu.

Defra (Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs) has confirmed that the threshold for mandatory registration on the GB Poultry Register will be reduced from 50 birds to one, and all poultry keepers will need to review their entry every year. The deadline is 1 Oct 2024.



The new rules cover owners of backyard flocks, birds of prey and pigeon fanciers, but do not affect caged pet birds

(excluding any poultry species) kept entirely inside a domestic dwelling, such as a parrot, canary or budgie, which never leaves the property other than to visit a vet or another short-term period.

#### **Derbyshire Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS)**

Local Nature Recovery Strategies are a new system of plans for nature and environmental improvement across England.

The purpose of these plans is to establish priorities and proposals to help nature to thrive and provide wider environmental benefits in the future. We are one of 48 councils across the country appointed to lead the strategy at a local level. We'll be mapping the location and condition of Derbyshire's habitats and identifying where biodiversity is in decline or limited in ecosystem value.

It was launched at a conference in January, when 120 delegates representing a wide range of organisations attended. The first task is to look at the current condition of our natural environment and what can be done to enrich it further, benefitting wildlife, boosting biodiversity, and giving habitats a helping hand.

Kilburn Baby and Toddler Group provided free games which were a hit with the little ones and some competitive big kids too!




There were tigers and glitter all around with the facepainting



There is no requirement to have experience in this role and training will be provided


